17<sup>th</sup> March 2020

You will be aware that on Thursday 12<sup>th</sup> March, the Government moved the action for tackling COVID-19 from 'containment' to 'delay'. Delay means slowing the spread, pushing it away from the winter season and lowering the peak impact. It has been made clear that schools currently will remain open, however, we have taken the decision the postpone activities that are not essential or carry excessive risk of exposure to the virus. We will continue to assess the risk of activities in and outside of school on a case by case basis.

Government advice received today 17<sup>th</sup> March 2020: If your child suffers from a cough or has a temperature of 37.8C (100F) or more, please ensure your child does not come to school and self isolates at home. Please call the school absence line and follow normal absence processes. They should remain at home until 14 days after the onset of symptoms. After 14 days if they feel better and no longer have a high temperature, they can return to their normal routine. If they had not had any signs of improvement and have not already sought medical advice, then contact NHS 111.

New advice has been issued on self-isolation where a family member may show symptoms, but others do not. Families of those self-isolating are now required to also self-isolate.

As a school, we continue to promote good hand washing and hygiene with our pupils:
